

ORDINANCE NO. 33B

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF PATTISON, WALLER COUNTY, TEXAS, ABOLISHING THE ELECTIVE OFFICE OF CITY MARSHALL AND THE APPOINTIVE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF POLICE AND TRANSFERRING ALL POLICE DUTIES TO THE COUNTY CONSTABLE.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 37, adopting and accepting the provisions of Chapter 1 to 10, Title 28, of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, relating to cities and towns has been passed and approved by the City Council of the Town of Pattison and filed and recorded in the office of the County Clerk of Waller County, Texas, Vol. 405, Page 379; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PATTISON, TEXAS:

There is hereby abolished the elective office of City Marshall and the one (1) year term appointive office of Chief of Police created and established in and for the Town of Pattison, Waller County, Texas, in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and hereby,

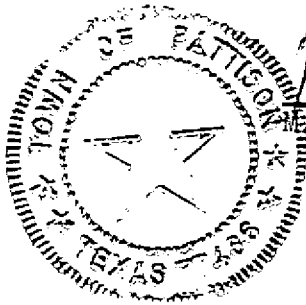
Police duties for the Town of Pattison are transferred to the Waller County Constable for this area. The Constable shall handle all police duties inside the City Limits in the same manner as he handles police duties outside the City Limits.
