

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PATTISON, TEXAS REGULATING TRUCK TRAFFIC AND DESIGNATING NO THROUGH TRUCK STREETS; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Pattison, Texas has the authority to regulate heavy truck traffic on the public roadways of the City pursuant to sections 311.001 and 621.303 of the Texas Transportation Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Pattison, Texas finds that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of its citizens to prohibit through truck traffic on certain streets within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council further finds that the prohibition of through truck traffic on the streets designated herein will help to prolong the life of those streets so designated; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to prohibit through truck traffic on the streets designated below.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PATTISON, TEXAS:

Section 1. FINDINGS

The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.

Section 2. NO THROUGH TRUCK STREETS.

- a. **Definitions**. The following words, terms and phrases when used in this ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
 - 1. Authorized emergency trucks shall mean fire department trucks, police trucks, public ambulances. Emergency trucks of municipal departments or public service corporations as are designated or authorized by the governing body of an incorporated city, private trucks operated by volunteer firemen or certified emergency medical volunteers while answering a fire alarm or responding to a medical emergency, and trucks owned by the state or by a political subdivision engaged in emergency utility repair or electric, water, or wastewater services.
 - 2. Light Truck shall mean any truck with a manufacturer's rated carrying capacity of two thousand (2,000) pounds or less, including trucks commonly known as pickup trucks, panel delivery trucks, and carryall trucks.



- 3. *Proof of Route* shall mean a written verification of pick-ups, deliveries, or destinations, which may include a log book, delivery slip, shipping order, bill or any other document which identifies and specifies the date, address, and name of the person requesting or directing the pick-up or delivery and the destination of the pick up or delivery.
- 4. *Truck* shall mean any motor vehicle designed, used or maintained primarily for the transportation of property, including "truck tractors", "road tractors", "trailers", "semi-trailers", "pole trailers" and "special mobile equipment" as those terms are defined in Texas Transportation Code Annotated § 541.201.
- 5. Terms not defined herein shall be construed in accordance with customary usage.

b. Through truck traffic prohibited.

Regulation. A person commits an offense if the person operates a Truck upon a public street designated as a no through truck street as established in Section 3 d below.

Section 3. AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSES.

- a. It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this section if:
 - 1. The vehicle was an authorized emergency vehicle;
 - 2. The vehicle was a school bus or Light Truck; or
 - 3. The Truck:
 - (i) was being driven to seek service or repairs at a facility that engages in the business or repairs of commercial motor vehicles or the Truck was being driven to fulfill a local commercial obligation to a buyer or seller at a given destination, evidenced by a bill of sale, invoice or other proof of route which shall be displayed immediately upon request; and (commercial waste disposal and recycling trucks servicing customers)
 - (ii) the public street was the only route to such destination.



Section 4. DESIGNATED NO THROUGH TRUCK TRAFFIC STREETS.

- a. The following routes shall be designated as no through truck traffic routes and as shown on the attached Exhibit "A":
 - Avenue B, Avenue E, Avenue F, Avenue G, Avenue H, Avenue I and Avenue J South of FM 359
 - Avenue A North of FM 359
 - Bell Bottom Circle
- b. The City shall erect and place signs designating the above streets as no through truck streets.

Section 5. Ordinances In Conflict

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 6. PENALTY

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction, be fined in an amount not to exceed \$500. Each violation shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 7. SEVERABILITY

In the event any clause, phrase, provision, sentence, or part of this Ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstance shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this Ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the City Council of the City of Pattison, Texas, declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.



Section 8. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption hereof, as provided by law.


